On August 31, 2011, the [DOJ brought an action](#) against AT&T to block its acquisition of T-Mobile. This Roundtable Discussion will focus on issues such as what arguments the Antitrust Division and AT&T are likely to make, how Sprint's opposition to the merger may affect the resolution of the case, what will happen if the FCC later decides not to affirm the DOJ's action, and how the panel would handicap the DOJ's chances of success if the case goes to trial. The panel will also consider whether merger analysis should take into account the presence of a dynamic market and rapidly evolving technology.
