Presenting and Preparing a Family Law Case for Trial: Ethical Issues

Are you fully prepared to deal with ethical issues that arise in the course of preparing and presenting a family law case at trial? Are you aware of ethical traps that might exist for the unwary lawyer?

Our faculty will consider such topics as:

- How far does the lawyer's duty of confidentiality extend, and when may the lawyer reveal information over the client's objection?
- Does the lawyer's duty of candor to the court require that the lawyer reveal all of the information the lawyer has? If not, where is the dividing line?
- What is permissible and impermissible conduct by a lawyer in discovery and in non-judicial investigation?
- What may a lawyer do when the lawyer is in possession of documents or communications that have been erroneously delivered?
- What are a lawyer's ethical obligations in representing a child and in representing a parent in a custody case?
- What in court and out of court relationships with the judge and opposing counsel pose ethical problems?
- How should a lawyer handle ethical issues that arise in "hidden cash" cases or cases involving cash only enterprises?
- What ethical issues arise in negotiation with the other lawyer or even with the other party?

The panel will consider these issues as presented by specific hypotheticals. Persons who enroll in the seminar will be encouraged to submit specific questions or comments to the panelists after the written seminar materials are available and before the seminar takes place. The panelists will then try to incorporate those questions or comments, to the extent possible, in their discussion of the hypotheticals.
