**John A. Zervopoulos, PhD, JD, ABPP**, a psychologist and lawyer, directs PsychologyLaw Partners, a forensic consulting service that applies the practical caselaw-based *PLAN Model* to help lawyers critique mental health experts' work and testimony and effectively address the resulting evidentiary reliability issues in court.

In addition, Dr. Zervopoulos writes extensively and presents seminars to lawyers and mental health professionals. His second book, *How to Examine Mental Health Experts: A Family Lawyer's Handbook of Issues and Strategies*, was published in 2013 by the American Bar Association. He also publishes *PsychologyLaw Brief*, a semimonthly email that offers practice tips to guide case preparation, assess the reliability of experts' methods and reasoning, sharpen deposition and court examinations, and frame legal arguments.

Among his professional activities, Dr. Zervopoulos served on the Expert Witness Committee of the State Bar of Texas Family Law Section and contributed several papers to the committee's published manual. He also served on the American Psychological Association's *Committee on Professional Practice and Standards* and the *Committee on Legal Issues*. In addition, he is a clinical assistant professor in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center at Dallas.

Dr. Zervopoulos received his BA from Wheaton College (IL) in 1974, his PhD in psychology from the University of North Texas in 1981, and his JD from Southern Methodist University Dedman School of Law in 1993. In 2002, he earned board certification in Forensic Psychology from the American Board of Professional Psychology.
