David Hoa Khoa Nguyen served as director of Disaster Legal Services (DLS), a partnership program between the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the Young Lawyers Division (YLD) of the American Bar Association (ABA), from 2010 to 2015. He speaks frequently on issues of disaster law and serving the legal needs of disaster survivors. Through this position, David increased the availability of pro bono legal services for a vulnerable and marginalized population and trained attorneys how to respond to the population's needs. David also served as special advisor to the DLS program and was a member of the ABA Standing Committee on Disaster Response and Preparedness (SCDRP).

David earned his bachelor of science (BS) in secondary education from Indiana University (IU) Bloomington. Thereafter, he obtained his juris doctor (JD) from the IU McKinney School of Law and his master of business administration (MBA) from the IU Kelley School of Business on the Indiana University–Purdue University Indianapolis (IUPUI) campus. As a recipient of the Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship, David earned his master of laws (LLM) in advanced legal studies from Leiden University in Leiden, the Netherlands. David earned his doctor of philosophy (PhD) in education policy studies from IU Bloomington.

Currently, he is an assistant professor in the department of Urban Education Leadership and Policy and an adjunct professor of law at IUPUI, where he teaches and does research in the areas of education law and policy. Previously, he was a professor at the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks, North Dakota, and at the University of Texas at San Antonio. Prior to working in academia, David worked at Indianapolis-based law firms, the federal courts, and state government. In 2006, David was a delegation member on the 2006 Indiana Food & Agriculture Trade Mission to Taiwan and Vietnam, where he and thirty-two other delegates and the Indiana lieutenant governor, represented Indiana businesses while developing business relations in Taiwan and Vietnam. David also served as a legal consultant, researching the issues of data protection in medical research and drafting proposals to be presented to the European Commission. In addition, David was a visiting professor of business ethics at Vietnam National University and a lecturer at the International Business & Law Academy, both in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.
