NOTICE OF COUNCIL DECISION

ARIZONA SUMMIT LAW SCHOOL

Teach-Out Plan

October 2018

This notice is being issued pursuant to Rule 48 of the ABA Rules of Procedure for Approval of Law Schools.

At a meeting on October 29-30, 2018, the Council of the Section of Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar of the American Bar Association (the "Council") considered a teach-out plan submitted by Arizona Summit Law School (the "Law School"). After careful review of the Law School's submission, the Council approved the revised teach-out plan filed on October 24, 2018.

As part of the teach-out plan, the Law School will announce that it is ceasing to operate its J.D. program. The Council will continue the Law School's accreditation through the spring 2020 term for the limited purpose of granting degrees to current Law School students who complete their degree requirements as transient students at other ABA-approved law schools. The Council retains the authority to remove the Law School's accreditation earlier than the conclusion of the spring 2020 term if the Law School's state license to issue a J.D. degree is withdrawn or terminated or if the Law School fails to uphold any of the obligations it agrees to undertake in the teach-out plan.
