NOTICE OF COUNCIL DECISION

UNIVERSITY OF LA VERNE COLLEGE OF LAW

Teach-Out Plan

February 2020

This notice is being issued pursuant to Rule 48 of the ABA Rules of Procedure for Approval of Law Schools.

At a meeting on February 20-22, 2020, the Council of the Section of Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar of the American Bar Association (the "Council") considered a teach-out plan submitted by the University of La Verne College of Law (the "Law School"). After careful review of the Law School's submission, the Council approved the teach-out plan filed on January 14, 2020.

The J.D. program offered through the teach-out plan remains an accredited program for the limited purpose of teaching out and issuing the J.D. degree to current students who meet the Law School's graduation requirements no later than the end of spring term 2023. Recipients of those degrees are considered by the Council to be graduates of an ABA-approved J.D. program.

The Council retains authority to terminate the teach-out plan and remove the J.D. program's accreditation earlier than August 2023 if the Law School's state license to issue a J.D. degree is withdrawn or terminated; the Law School fails to uphold any of the obligations it agrees to undertake in the teach-out plan; or all students subject to the teach-out plan have graduated, transferred, been academically dismissed, or otherwise terminated their legal education.

Questions pertaining to the teach-out plan should be directed to the Law School. In accordance with the Rules of Procedure governing confidentiality, the Office of the Section of Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar will not disclose the details of the teach-out plan to the public.
