Statement Regarding the Status of Indiana Tech Law School

The Council of the ABA Section of Legal Education and Admissions to the Bar has been informed by the President of Indiana Tech and the Dean of its law school that the law school intends to close and to cease operations on June 30, 2017.

We will proceed to provide the formal notices of this decision to the appropriate parties, pursuant to [Rule 34](#) of the ABA Rules of Procedure for the Approval of Law Schools.

Rule 34 provides a process for submission and review of a 'teach-out plan' in the event a provisionally approved law school announces its intention to close. We will follow the requirements of that rule and expect the institution and the law school will do the same.

The primary purpose of this rule and a teach-out arrangement is to assist students at the school in finding reasonable opportunities to complete their education without additional charges. The Council, through the Managing Director's Office, will cooperate with the law school in accomplishing this objective.
