



Jennifer Smith is an associate professor of law at Florida A&M University College of Law in Orlando, FL. Before becoming a law professor, Professor Smith was a partner with and a department chair of the international law firm of Holland & Knight LLP. She practiced in the firm's Washington, D.C. and Miami offices. Prior to becoming a partner, Holland & Knight LLP recognized her as an "extraordinary associate." Professor Smith was also recognized by the Young Lawyers Division of the Washington Bar Association as the "Young Lawyer of the Year" in 2002. While an associate with Holland & Knight, she took a leave from the law firm to volunteer as a human rights attorney with the Legal Resources Centre in Johannesburg, South Africa. Before joining Holland & Knight, Professor Smith served as a federal judicial law clerk to the Honorable Joseph W. Hatchett, U.S. Court of Appeals, Eleventh Circuit.

Professor Smith has taught Civil Procedure, Electronic Discovery, Conflict of Laws, Federal Courts, Remedies, Health Law, and Trial Practice, and she founded and directed the Housing Law and Real Estate Commission Law Clinics. Professor Smith's writings have appeared in several law journals including the University of Virginia's Journal of Law & Politics, the Chapman Law Review, the Maine Law Review, and the Houston Journal of Health Law and Policy. She holds a B.S. from Hampton University and a J.D. from the University of Miami School of Law. She is admitted to practice in Florida, Maryland, the District of Columbia, and the Supreme Court of the United States.
