

How to Use the Cumulative Index

The index covers all issues of the *Franchise Law Journal* from 2000 through 2008 and will be updated annually.

The index is organized by topic in alphabetical order. The list of topics, which was prepared by the *Journal's* editorial board in 2008, follows on page 2.

The index entry for each article contains the following information:

- Name of article
- Author(s)
- Volume number
- Issue number
- Page number
- Year of publication

To find articles on a specific topic, just go to the topic heading in the index. Articles on that topic are listed in reverse chronological order. Make a note of the volume, issue, and page numbers. Return to the *Journal's* website (http://www.abanet.org/forums/franchising/franchise_law_journal/index.html), which includes pdf copies of the *Journal* published during the past nine years. Once you open the volume and issue number, you should be able to find the article fairly easily.

Note: Some Adobe programs have a limited search capacity. To find a specific phrase (or title) in a pdf, click on **CTRL F** and type in the phrase in the search box.

Example

To find an article on vicarious liability, go to the topic heading “Vicarious Liability” on the index. Let’s say that you want to look at the following article:

Dean T. Fournaris, *Inadvertent Employer: Legal and Business Risks of Employment Determinations to Franchise Systems*, Volume 27, Issue 4, Page 224 (2008)

Return to the *Journal's* home page (http://www.abanet.org/forums/franchising/franchise_law_journal/index.html) and click on Volume 27:4 (3rd row from top-far left-hand column). The article appears on page 224. Once you download the article, you can also do a limited web search with some Adobe programs by clicking CTRL F.
