

**Hannah Benton** is an Equal Justice America Fellow at the Center for Children's Advocacy in Hartford, Connecticut. At CCA, Hannah provides representation to children participating in the Truancy Court Prevention Project (TCPP), which uses case management, informal court sessions, and legal assistance to address the root causes of students' attendance problems. Through CCA's TeamChild Juvenile Justice Project, Hannah represents children involved in the status offender and juvenile justice systems on issues of access to mental health and special education services. As part of CCA's Girls' Juvenile Justice Project, Hannah conducts trainings to court-involved girls about their legal rights. Hannah also engages in systemic advocacy on issues including access to interventions and diversionary programs, provision of special education services, truancy and dropout prevention, and policing in schools. Hannah graduated from the University of Chicago in 2004 and Yale Law School in 2008.
