

Tobie J. Smith is a staff attorney with the Legal Aid Society of Birmingham, serving as a *de facto* public defender for juveniles in Jefferson County, Alabama, since 2002. He received a B.S. from Birmingham-Southern College in 1997 and a J.D. from Cumberland School of Law in 2002.
