Dear Colleagues:

The Annual Meeting of the Forum returns to New Orleans in April 2009, just in time for the annual French Quarter Festival, with a program focused on cutting edge "green" and alternative energy topics. The program, **"Talking Green Blues: Energy, Sustainability, and Green Building Challenges Affecting the Construction Industry,"** will focus on legal issues surrounding sustainable and green building projects, as well as the legal challenges involved in construction of alternative energy facilities. The initial plenary sessions start off with the tools you need for the rest of the program.

The current economic crisis and our dependence on foreign oil has forced our nation and our industry to focus more on alternative sources of energy, leading to the growth of the wind-energy industry, and has also caused energy companies to revisit building nuclear power plants for the first time in 35 years. This program will include a legal and practical roadmap on nuclear power plant projects, construction of wind farms, and environmental due diligence on construction sites. We will wrap up on Saturday morning with an overview of the rebuilding of New Orleans post-Katrina, and an ethics session addressing issues that arise when lawyers come face-to-face with a natural disaster.

We are very pleased to have an incredible cast of speakers who are truly experts in their fields—lawyers, consultants, and design professionals who are passionate about the topics they address. The volunteer speakers and program coordinators have worked hard to put on a great program for you, but regular attendees of Forum meetings know that our meetings are not just about CLE, and we hope that after this Annual Meeting you will know that, too. The program at the Annual Meeting will have you thinking green while you get a taste of French Quarter food, hear the blues and get a first-hand view of the re-birth of New Orleans.

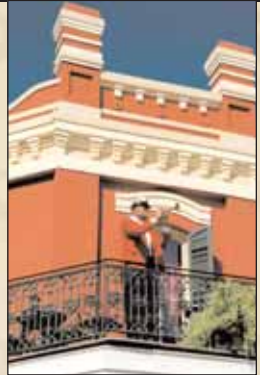

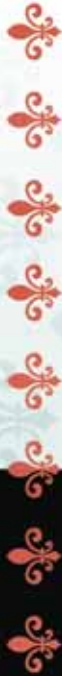
