You could run for **1st Circuit Governor (deadline: Feb 1)** or for a **national officer position (various deadlines in Jan, Feb, and June)**, or you could apply to be a **student liaison** to a particular section (**deadline: Feb 15**), or you could apply to serve as a **Lieutenant Governor** to whomever is elected Circuit Governor this spring (**approx. May**). Or maybe you really like writing and editing; you could apply to be **Student Editor of *Student Lawyer Magazine* (deadline: Feb 1)**. Serving in a leadership role for the ABA Law Student Division continues to be an amazing experience for me, and I highly recommend it. You get a chance to improve your public speaking skills, meet students and lawyers from across the country, and expand your toolbox of leadership skills like chairing meetings, delegating, and manage people. Each school gets 2 votes for Governor - the SBA President, and primary ABA Rep (each voter must be an ABA Law Student Division member in good standing) - and there is a proxy system if an officer can't make the meeting. The meeting is open to all law students in the 1st Circuit, so I hope you'll all join us!
