The newly elected circuit governor will contact liaison candidates from their circuit to arrange a time for a mandatory interview. Interviews are held via telephone or face-to-face meetings depending upon the applicant's locale to the governor. **Appointment will be made in May.** Every effort will be made to notify all applicants by May 15, 2011 as to the disposition of their applications.

Your application form, statement of intent and resume MUST be postmarked no later than February 15, 2011, using an overnight mail service (for example, FedEx, DHL, UPS) to furnish clear proof of sending and receipt. Applications sent via regular U.S. mail will be disqualified. This is a "strict liability" deadline and requirement. No exceptions will be granted.
