Q: *Military member refusing to cooperate with interim spousal support order*

I have a client who is requesting interim spousal support. Her husband is a retiree of the U.S. Army. He refuses to cooperate in discovery, and the motion to compel has been filed, but in the meantime, I want to serve whichever section/department is appropriate so I can obtain the records. Can anyone tell me who/what to serve with the subpoena duces tecum?

A: My staff informs me that the Army has subcontracted its subpoena processing out to a contractor. (By the way, be SURE to have a judge give you an original signature, even if your form only has a blank for a court clerk; I've never had a judge refuse, and it can usually be done ex parte by letter request, since it is something that the clerk would do anyway, if ineffectually). May be better to call in advance, and ask which address to use; if you find out for sure, please let us know:
