

# In Memoriam

Edward N. Delaney

Edward N. Delaney, 80, a lawyer specializing in tax law, died Feb. 11, 2008 of congestive heart failure at his home in Potomac, MD.

Mr. Delaney moved to Washington in 1975 in mid-career to establish Delaney and Associates. He retired in 2002. He was born in Chicago and served in the Marines during World War II in the western Pacific and China. He graduated from Loyola University's law school in Chicago in 1948 and received a master of laws degree in 1950 from New York University's Graduate Tax Program. He worked in the Internal Revenue Service's office of chief counsel in New York before entering private practice in Minneapolis. He later practiced law with a private firm and with United Investors Life Insurance in Kansas City, Mo., before moving to Washington.

Mr. Delaney served as chair of the American Bar Association Section of Taxation during 1983-84, and was a member of the American Law Institute. He also served on the board of directors of the Washington Performing Arts Society and on the executive committee of the Ambassadors Ball of the national capital chapter of the Multiple Sclerosis Society. He was a member of the Metropolitan Club.

Survivors include his wife of 57 years, Carole P. Delaney of Potomac; four children, Deborah A. Rogers of Gettysburg, Pa., Kathleen A. Langan of Potomac, Dorian A. Delaney of Bethesda and Edward N. Delaney II of Silver Spring; a sister; nine grandchildren; and six great-grandchildren.\*
